

II Message from our President



President Steve Arnott

I am delighted to have been asked to write this my first message, as the new President of Whitley Bay Pantomime Society. In retrospect, I remember very well the society's 1968 production of Sleeping Beauty, which I saw as a schoolboy. I appeared in their 1981 show as King Stephan.

The story of The Sleeping Beauty is of French origin although these days, the word 'The' is often dropped from the title. At the turn of the last century, it was presented at the Theatre Royal Drury Lane by the eminent pantomime producer, J. Hickory Wood, with Herbert Campbell and Dan Leno as the king and queen. In 1958, Edmund Hockridge played the prince at the London Palladium against the tradition of a female Principal Boy, which is often the norm in professional productions these days. And of course, the famous female impersonator Danny La Rue appeared in 'Queen Passionella and the Sleeping Beauty' in London in 1967 at the Saville Theatre.

As a performer, you rehearse a pantomime without the missing member of the cast (the audience) who join you on opening night. It's all about participation. Oh yes it is! I hope you enjoy the show and please keep theatre alive in Whitley Bay.
